

Something spiritual happens when the church provides scriptural holiness into the environment in which it ministers.


People who have little interest in church or holy conversations are engaged and begin to experience Wesley's prevenient grace beginning to work within them.

In the first six months of 2019 through the generosity of the people of First, Grace, Lake Park, the Valley Parish Churches and others there have been over 279 times families have been helped financially.

Through these encounters there were also opportunities to share in the important situations of the lives of our neighbors. In hard times many are open to sharing deeply of spiritual, emotional, physical, and financial concerns. Prayer has been offered often and invitations have been extended for growth in faith.

There were many others who called, I responded by leaving messages that were not returned. Other times the messages contained insufficient information to get back in touch.

In all, almost \$10,200 were dispersed to meet needs for shelter, food, medicine, diapers and personal items, transportation for medical appointments and work, and a myriad of miscellaneous needs. This is over 56% of the total for all of 2018.

All of these encounters come with a story that represents people who are children of God. They include families with young children, teenagers, single moms, single dads, and adults of all ages and experience. Some find the greatest help from talking and praying together. Some have never asked for help before and find it difficult. Others are well seasoned in asking and receiving. Some refer their loved ones or neighbors as they recognize the needs of others. Most are extremely appreciative and desire to give back.

A family has been able to support their child who is receiving treatment for behavioral issues by making trips to visit about 250 miles away. He is now reunited with his family.

Ongoing transportation help has been given to a family with a child who has muscular dystrophy as medical appointments abound.

An emergency was cared for as a father was able to pick up his child and bring her to his home following the unexpected arrest and imprisonment of her mother.

(A woman with a history of drug addiction and imprisonment has been clean for several years since her commitment to Christ became real to her in prison. She has had many medical

problems and has received emotional and spiritual support and financial help to get to appointments and medical treatment. She has a heart for those in need and has sought help for others as well.) Update from this report from last year: This woman now has a job and is feeling even more positive about her faith journey and herself.

Several newly single parent families have been helped to get back on their feet following devastating abandonment by the bread winner of the family.

A family in which the wife/mother and a son have many health issues has received help to maintain a roof over their head as the husbandl/father has needed to miss work to care for the health related treatments of his family.

I thank God for you and your generous gifts that made this help possible.
